

REGISTER BOTH YOUR LAND LINE AND YOUR MOBILE PHONES WITH 9-1-1 FOR EMERGENCY FIRE INFORMATION

We strongly recommend that you go to this Deschutes County website and register your cell phones. [www.deschutes.org/9-1-1-Service-District/Citizen-Emergency-Notification-System-\(CENS\).aspx](http://www.deschutes.org/9-1-1-Service-District/Citizen-Emergency-Notification-System-(CENS).aspx). By registering you become able to receive notification of developing threats specific to our area. This is much faster and more effective than TV, radio, or neighbors. The website is very informative about how this service functions and for what kinds of emergencies.

Registered phone numbers immediately give the Deschutes County 9-1-1 service your house location if you dial 9-1-1 and for the authorities to alert particular areas in case of an emergency. If your house phone is directly plugged into the wall phone jack, you already have the 9-1-1 features on that phone. If your phone is plugged into a modem, then you have VOIP or wireless service. Do register this phone number along with your cell phones. Some VOIP services already have the 9-1-1 service; but to be sure, register that home phone.

Review these website for suggestions on what to have ready for an evacuation. Take time to make your own plans. You will not have much time if we face a Level 2 Evacuation Alert
